- Organisations may be nominated or self-nominated and should be currently working in HIV and/or sexual healthcare in the UK. Work submitted must relate to the preceding five years from the point of application.

Applicants must submit the following documentations in PDF format:

- Duly completed application form
- A letter of support (max 1,000 words)
- Any additional supporting documents (upto a maximum of five)
